Results of Our Tartan Rug profiles showing areas identified as red against national benchmarking

1. Children in poverty 15.5% higher than county average

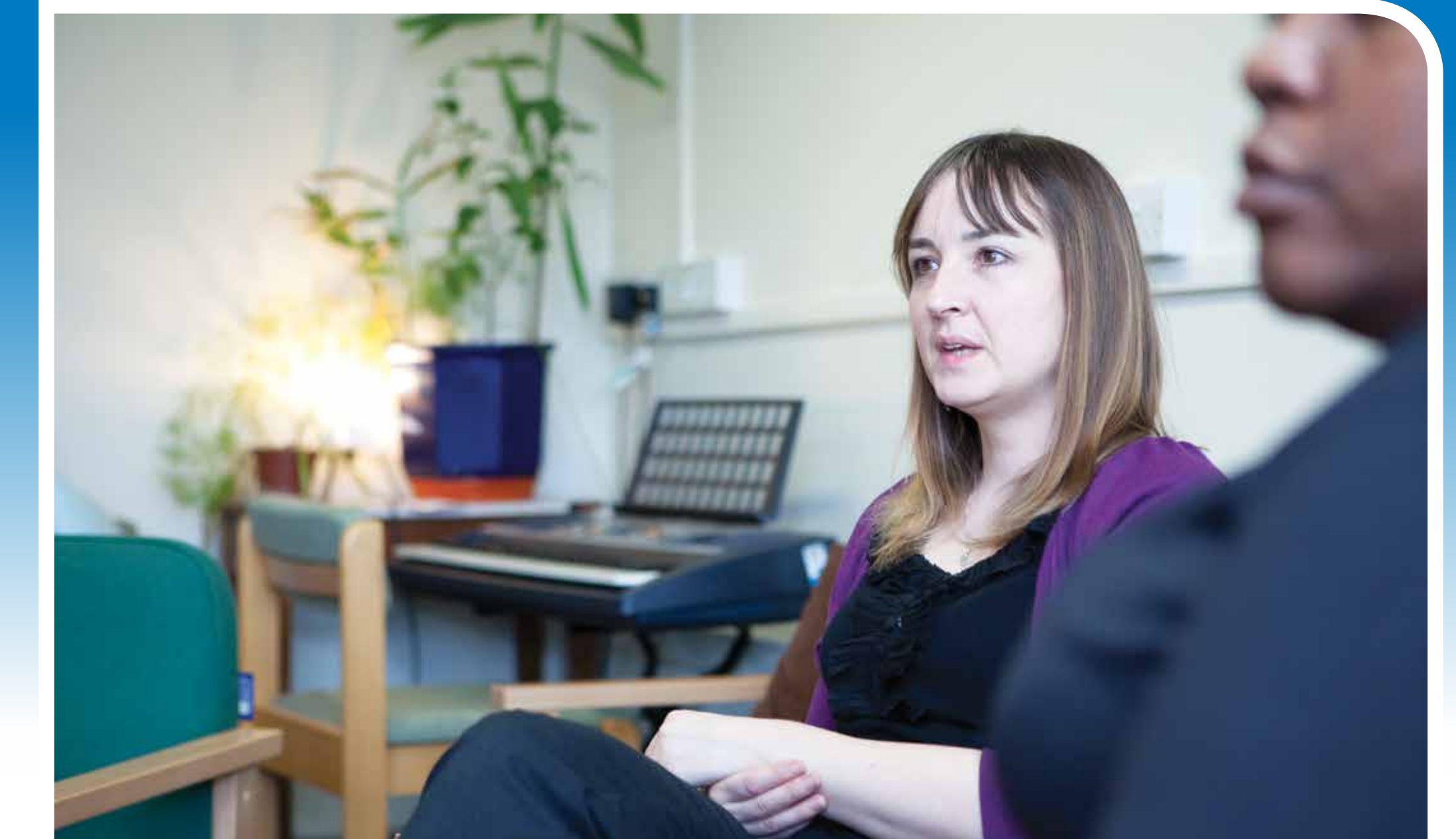

Some Key Partnership Initiatives:

Three Rivers District Council will use some of their Public Health Funding for an 'Adults with Mental Health Programme' to target physical and social activities at adults with mental health problems via self-support groups facilitated by Herts MIND Network and Age UK, including working age adults, and older adults with dementia.

ASCEND and **Herts MIND Network** have been delivering the Step-Up Learning and Wellbeing Project in South Oxhey (our most deprived area) for over 4 years. This includes delivery of counselling, support group work and learning and training (including an allotment project) for people with mental health issues. ASCEND and MIND's services are complimented by the learning and training delivered by ASCEND and Drug & Alcohol support delivered by CRI Spectrum from the Centre.

Three Rivers District Council also support **SIGNPOST** who delivers Counselling to Young People in Rickmansworth. They are also working on a project to identify and support people who self-harm earlier. They have an ambition to take direct referrals from Watford General A&E who are admitted due to self-harm and offer them counselling as part of their hospital discharge plan.
